



## Going Public

You can't tell us everything you learned. You need to break it down and focus on the most important things. (about 5 minutes) We want to hear the PROCESS (or story) of your inquiry – your steps, your roadblocks, your sources, your new questions and most importantly – your synthesis!

You choose how best to “Go Public” based on your topic:

Powerpoint, Poster, Demonstration

These Areas **MUST** be in your Presentation:

- **Original Question** – what is your question and why did you choose this question?
- Did your question change over this process?
- **Sources:** what types of sources did you use? what was your best source? Why?
- **Roadblocks:** what problems did you encounter during your research? How did you solve them?
- **Research:** The information you found out about your question. What did you learn?
- Did your question change over this process?
- What **New Questions** came up during your inquiry? Did you find answers to them? **What questions do you still have?** If you were to keep inquiring on this topic, where would you go next?

**\*Synthesis/Learning Statements:** At the beginning of this inquiry I thought ...

Now after all my research I now know/realize/am coming to understand ...

  - **Visuals** to support your learning
  - Make sure your presentation is creative and engaging
  - **Neatness, Spelling and Clarity** counts – as does the **Care and Effort** that goes into your finished product
