



You can't tell us everything you learned. You need to break it down and focus on the most important things. (about 5 minutes) We want to hear the PROCESS (or story) of your inqury – your steps, your roadblocks, your sources, your new questions and most importantly – your synthesis!

You choose how best to "Go Public" based on your topic:

Powerpoint, Poster, Demonstration

These Areas **MUST** be in your Presentation:

- Original Question what is your question and why did you choose this question?
- Did your question change over this process?
- Sources: what types of sources did you use? what was your best source? Why?
- **Roadblocks**: what problems did you encounter during your research? How did you solve them?
- Research: The information you found out about your question. What did you learn?
- Did your question change over this process?
- What New Questions came up during your inquiry? Did you find answers to them? What questions do you still have? If you were to keep inquiring on this topic, where would you go next?

*Synthesis/Learning Statements: At the beginning of this inquiry I thought ...
