9. flail: thrash about

10. <u>fitful</u>: occurring in spells and often abruptly

11. kindling: material for starting a fire

Each word spoken in the Circle was like kindling added to his smoldering anger.

12. **COAX**: influence or urge by gentle urging, caressing, or flattering

Steady blowing soon coaxed a weak flame to life.

13. **welt:** a raised mark on the skin

After being strapped until his skin was raw with welts, he watched in horror as his dad paused and turned the belt around with his big knuckled hands.

14. <u>roil</u>: be agitated

For two hours his mind roiled with turbulent thoughts before he fell into a restless, tortured sleep.

15. **<u>strut</u>**: walk with a lofty proud gait

He rushed toward the gulls, hollering and swinging his arms until the strutting scavengers abandoned their find.

16. rivulet: a small stream

Raindrops beaded on its white bushy hair and dripped off in miniature rivulets.
